Excursions

There will be several organised excursion options on Tuesday afternoon, all nearby the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine building on the National Mall of Washington. We will send you more information on options, sign-

Lunchtime workshops

These are new in 2024! We will have longer lunch breaks this year, which will thus include workshops, and allow for a more relaxed time together, where you can jointly work and enjoy a meal.

Activities Fair

This is a well-loved format at the AGMs. Get together with the representatives of GYA working groups, Incubators, projects and committees to find out what they do, ask all the questions you may have and plan your own path within the GYA in the coming year.

Gala Dinner

As with every year, there will be a special Gala Dinner where we celebrate together with partners, guests and the AGM host. Don't forget to pack something slightly fancier for this dinner, possibly from your own country's fashion culture.

Working Groups Meetings

Blocks of 60-90 minutes or more are set aside for GYA Activities groups to meet, discuss and plan their year ahead. A schedule will be released in due time.

U.S. Partnerships Expo

This Expo is a major networking opportunity that makes the most of the AGM location and connections of the National Academies. Around 50 representatives of science and technology, and science policy organisations from government, foundations, academia, the non-profit sector, education and science diplomacy

PREPARE FOR THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The General Assembly is the most important internal format of the GYA. During this time, GYA members (Alumni plus and alumni may also join) come together to discuss the development of the organisation, and, if needed, vote to implement changes or agree on new activities.

The Smithsonian

The Smithsonian Institution is an independent federal trust with private support. Their vision is to enrich the lives of the American people and advance its mission for "the increase and diffusion of knowledge."

This adds up to an impressive group of museums, all free of cost and located near the AGM venue. The Smithsonian also includes education and research centers, with a collection of 154 million objects. The Smithsonian is also involved in conserving biodiversity, cultural heritage, and other fields of science and art.

The Library of Congress

The Library of Congress is the largest library in the world, with millions of books, films and video, audio recordings, photographs, newspapers, maps and manuscripts in its collections. The Library is the main research arm of the U.S. Congress and the home of the U.S. Copyright Office.

Approximately half of the Library's book and serial collections are in languages other than English. The collections contain materials in some 470 languages.
