The 2026 GYA Annual General Meeting (AGM) and International Conference of Young Scientists will take place from 30 June to 3 July 2026, with a pre-

Conference workshop for new members planned from 28 to 29 June 2026 (pending funding confirmation), at Constructor University, in Bremen, Germany.

The 2026 International Conference of Young Scientists will focus on **“Machine Intelligence for Society and Sciences.”** Plenary panels will address the topics:

- AI at the Core of Disciplinary Foundations in the Humanities and Social Sciences
- Accelerating Discovery: AI’s Transformative Role in Natural Sciences and Engineering
- AI Governance for a Shared Future: Science, Policy, and Global Equity

AGM sessions throughout the week provide space to collaborate and initiate projects and develop the GYA as an organization.

Research Talks

In Research Talks sessions, GYA members and alumni share their research and expertise with one another; in short, engaging presentations (around 3-4 minutes). The format aims to showcase the incredible diversity of research within the GYA community and inspire collaboration. Research Talks should clearly communicate your work and its impact in an accessible way for an interdisciplinary audience.

Important to know: Visa fees (90 EUR) may be waived for researchers attending scientific conferences (EU Directive 2016/801). Check visa requirements at the page above and consult the [German Federal Foreign Office](#) for more information.

Travel Co-Funding

GYA Members and Alumni-plus institutionally based in ODA-recipient countries who have not been successful in finding other funding sources can apply for GYA travel co-funding to attend the AGM. Co-funding can cover up to 70% of travel and visa costs.

Furthermore, funded accommodation (shared twin room) for up to five nights may be provided to GYA Members and Alumni-plus from all countries who indicated their need via the co-funding application form.

Funds are limited and awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, with priority given to the 2026 cohort of incoming members. Applications will be accepted between early/mid-March and 12 April 2026 and processed in clusters, so we advise applying early to increase your chances. We will send

you an e-mail when applications for co-funding open – this will happen as soon as possible, pending funding confirmations.
